- To review the school's behaviour and intervention record keeping systems.

- To considers any exclusion appeals on behalf of the governors: An appeals panel of three Governors (excluding the Headteacher) will consider
 - The circumstances in which the pupil was excluded
 - Any representation by parents and the LA
 - Whether the pupil should be reinstated

1. MEMBERSHIP

- 1.1 The Pupil Progress & Discipline Committee shall consist of not less than three and no more than six governors including the Headteacher.
- 1.2 The committee may appoint such co-opted, non-voting members as agreed by the governing body. These members will serve in an advisory capacity and may include staff nominated by the head teacher following consultation with the committee.
- 1.3 Other members of the governing body may attend meetings of the PP&D committee and may contribute to discussions on matters under consideration.
- 1.4 Only full members of the committee, as approved by the Governing body, shall have the right to vote on any resolution placed before the committee.

2. QUORUM

2.1 The quorum shall be three governors.

3. MEETINGS

- 3.1 The Committee shall meet approximately 2 weeks prior to a full Governing Body meeting, or more frequently as may be required from time to time.
- 3.2 Each meeting the committee shall review the dates of future meetings to ensure that a schedule exists for the academic year.

4. CHAIRMANSHIP

4.1 The chair of the committee shall be elected annually at the first meeting of the academic year.

5. STANDING ORDERS

- 5.1 The agenda for the meeting shall be distributed at least seven days before the meeting.
- 5 2 A summary of decisions taken and points for action will be noted on a copy of the agenda as a record of the proceedings of the meeting.
- 5.3 Where there is an equality of votes for and against a particular resolution the matter will he referred back to the next full meeting of the governing body.
- 5.4 A report of proceedings of meetings of the PP&D committee shall be circulated with the papers of the next full meeting of the Governing Body.

6. DECLARATION OF INTERESTS

6.1 Where there is a conflict between the interests of any governor and the interests of the governing body, that person must declare the interest and withdraw from the meeting. If there is any dispute as to whether a person must withdraw from a meeting under the regulations on governing body procedures, the other governors present at the meeting will decide on the matter.

This document shall be reviewed annually by the Governing Body, or sooner, if required.
