We have been using the theme of Eggs for learning, and have spent lots of time outdoors spotting signs of spring and enjoying the sunshine when it has been out.

There have been lots of stories, rhymes, songs and even a toad rescue mission on the school field one day!





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Junior class news

In Science, Juniors have been exploring how shadows are created and what can change them. We carried out indoor and outdoor experiments to consider natural and man made light sources and shadows.

In English we have been honing ourcomprehension skills using Comprehension Ninja resourcesincluding skimming, scanning, retrieval and summarising!

Juniors have been developing problem solving skills with 1 and 2 step word problems in Maths this half term.

In History, we have finished our presentations on The Ancient and Modern Olympics. These were presented in PowerPoint and poster formats.

The children have all been working hard to achieve their personal reading targets this half term.

Infant class news

Y2 and Reception have continued to learn all about emergency services, especially the Fire and Rescue Service, which tied in with our fantastic trip to the fire station. We have also been looking at non-fiction books all about emergency services and learning to use the content page and glossary.

We have been continuing to practise phonics and Y2 have been building on comprehension skills, as well as writing facts about the fire station visit.

In Maths, Y2 have been learning about fractions with their friend Fractionstein, and Reception have been learning about number bonds to 10.

Our class topic has been 'Lights, Camera, Action', and so we have learned all about light sources and used the sun to do shadow drawings. In Geography, we have been using maps to look at symbols in the Lake District such as campsites.

In History and Design and Technology Infant class have been learning about the Wright brothers, their first flights and we even created our very own flying objects.
