Meet the Staff

Our School is set out into two classrooms, Acorn Class for the Early Years and Key Stage 1 and Oak Class for Key Stage 2.

Our KS1 and Early Years Lead is Mrs Stobbart and our KS2 Lead and Headteacher is Mrs Rooney.

Mrs Rooney and Mrs Thomson are our Key Stage 2 teachers, and they are supported by Mrs Ritson.

Mrs Stobbart and Mrs Stephenson are our Early Years and Key Stage 1 teachers, and they are supported by Mrs Batey.

Each week, we have a Sports Coach delivering our P.E lessons and a our lunchtime sports club, and individual music lessons are available with a peripatetic music teacher.

We have Mrs Lyons and Mrs Rawlings who work in the school office, and Mrs Blair who is our school cook.

We are are a friendly team, who are lucky enough to get to know our pupils and their families very well and pride ourselves on delivering the best learning opportunities possible to our fantastic pupils.

Our School

Walton and Lees Hill Primary School is set in the picturesque, peaceful countryside, just six miles from Brampton.

We are a unique school in that our our staff to pupil ratio is 1:5, which means that we can offer smaller class sizes and more individual support for pupils than many other schools can.

We boast expansive outdoor school grounds and also have a large school hall, perfect for gathering together for our School Lunches, Collective Worship and Community Events.

Outdoor Learning

Our school grounds are large, enabling us to have lots of outdoor learning opportunities. From opportunities for structured sports, to free-play such as den building, outdoor snack time at our picnic benches, worship and outside teaching in our amphitheatre and calming moments in our sensory garden, we have a wealth of opportunity available for all our pupils.

Inspiring Learning

Our curriculum is broad and is designed to inspire learning in all of our pupils by reinforcing key skills and using varying learning strategies to engage all types of learner.

Subjects are delivered using a central topic as our focus, which allows cross-curricular links to be developed, deepening understanding and creating relevance.

Some subjects are taught discreetly, where appropriate e.g Maths to ensure that key skills and strategies are developed to promote progression.

We encourage all children to reach their full potential across the curriculum, regardless of age, sex, race or ability by aiming to develop positive attitudes and promoting enjoyment and fascination of every subject through interesting, stimulating and varied tasks.

Keeping you informed

Each term parents and carers will be invited to meet with their child's class teacher to discuss their progress. At the end of the academic year, a written report will be sent out describing learning, progress and development over all curriculum areas.

Parents and carers are welcome to make an appointment with teachers anytime and staff are always happy to chat with you and answer any queries. Good communication between home, school and external agencies means that we can facilitate the best possible provision for each child.



Extended Curriculum

As well as the diverse range of learning we present within our day-to-day teaching, there are many extra curricular opportunities offered here at Walton and Lees Hill Primary School. These opportunities help enhance our pupils already rich curriculum and increase their cultural capital.

Our after school and lunchtime clubs provide great opportunities for pupils to develop key skills such as cooking, team work and leadership skills and developing their sports and fitness.

We try to compliment our in-class learning with visits from specialists who can help us to improve our skills and understanding, and by going on trips to bring our learning to life.

Recent trips have included Beamish, Samye Ling, UDance, TalkinTarn, Brampton Fire Station, Lanercost Priory and weekly swimming which allows the children "It's fun gardening to see their learning in a different context and gives them first-hand experiences.

KS2 also go on a residential trip each year, and we offer a movie night and sleepover in school during the school year as well.

We have been making the most of our fantastic grounds by sowing seeds in our greenhouse and planting vegetables and fruit in our gardens. We also have two hens who lay eggs for us each day.

School Hours

Our school day begins at 8:55am, but parents and carers are welcome to drop pupils off from 8:30am.

The school day ends at 3:25pm and each school week is 32.5 hours.

There will be a member of staff in school from 8:15am if you need to contact them. The school office opens at 8:30am.

Mornings usually consist of Reading, SPaG, Maths and English, with a healthy snack and break mid-morning.

After lunch and second break, lessons will include Music, P.E, Art and Humanities.

School Meals and Snacks

Hot, nutritious school lunches are available for pupils each day. All KS1 children are entitled to Universal Free School Meals.

Children are welcome to bring a packed lunch into school if they prefer, however we do not allow pure confectionary and are a nutfree school.

School Day

Wellbeing Wednesdays

On Wednesdays to encourage wellbeing and positive mental health, we have an extended snack time, where we offer a range of snacks to encourage pupils to try new foods.

We use this time to encourage children to talk to staff and each other, and give an opportunity for show-and-tell, if there's something pupils would like to share.



After School Club

We run after school clubs on two afternoons a week until 4:30pm. One club is usually with a sports coach, and the other with staff. The clubs change from term to term but have included Lego Club, Cookery and STEM Club. If there is not enough uptake for after school, we offer a lunchtime club instead.

We do not currently have any requirements for wrap-around care, however, this could be made available by arrangement with the Head Teacher but will incur a small charge.

Open door policy

School Family

Our School is made up of two main classrooms, Oak Class, which is Key Stage 2, and Acorn Class, which is made up of Key Stage 1 and the Early Years.

Our class sizes mean that we are able to offer each pupil the support or challenge they need.

Oak Class

Oak Class is our Key Stage 2 classroom for pupils in Year 3 to Year 6. The classroom is spacious and contains fantastic facilities, such as our modern ICT equipment.

The Oak Class classroom adjoins our super school library, ensuring pupils always have access to a plethora of books to support their learning and research.

Acorn Class

Acorn Class consists of our Early Years and Key Stage 1 pupils.

Acorn Class have a large classroom, with lots of learning and play opportunities combined, plus a covered outdoor area, ensuring they can get outside even on the wettest of days!

Acorn Class have their own toilets and cloakroom which are connected the class to encourage independence and self-care.



Sapling Class

We have a fantastic classroom space situated in the school grounds, known Sapling Class. We use this Classroom for KS1 pupils more structured work, so they can access a space that is independent to our Early Years cohort.

Sapling Class is a brilliant, quiet learning zone for our pupils and is a great resource to have access to!



Ofsted

We are an Ofsted rated 'Good' school and inspectors found that this is a happy school with a strong climate for learning.
